NOTES

Rules & Regulations

30. A 'bona fide' Cottage Gardener or Allotment Holder is a person not employing any professional assistance in the cultivation of his or her garden, nor working for any other person as a gardener, assistant or market gardener.
31. The exhibits in the classes described must be grown by the person competing, except for Floral Art and Children's classes.
32. Entry Fee to all classes – Except Children's Classes is 20p
33. No exhibiter is allowed to stage more than two exhibits in any one class.
34. The section committee shall be at liberty to select persons to inspect the gardens of intending exhibitors and all productions entered for a competition must be shown in the growing state if required. Should any doubt arise as to the exhibits sent for competition the committee reserves to itself the power to appoint inspectors to inspect the garden or place of cultivation of such an exhibitor and to make such further enquiries and investigations as may be deemed necessary.
35. The decision of the judges shall be final. If the judges deem an exhibit not of sufficient merit they may recommend that prizes be withheld or reduced.
36. All disputes will be settled by the section committee. Any person wishing to make an objection must do so to the section secretary before 3:00pm and must deposit £5.00, which will be returned if the objection is sustained.
37. All specimens exhibited must remain untouched until 4:30pm on the day of the show (unless permission be granted by the section secretary) when they may be removed by the exhibitors, who shall be there to claim them.
38. The committee shall not be held responsible for losses arising from any cause, but will use all reasonable care whilst exhibits are in their charge.
39. Any person breaking or endeavouring to evade any of these rules will forfeit any prize awarded.
40. Staging of exhibits will not be permitted after 10:30am when the marquee will be closed for judging.
41. No exhibits may be removed or sold before 4:30pm.
42. Exhibitors must bring their own vases, boxes and trays.
43. Judging will be according to the latest edition of the Horticultural Handbook of the Royal Horticultural Society.
44. Exhibitors should name their exhibits where possible.
45. The interpretation of the foregoing rules shall be left to the section committee.
46. 1st Prize – 3 points, 2nd Prize – 2 points, 3rd Prize – 1 point.
47. Prize money will be paid in the marquee after 4:00pm. If not claimed by 5:00 pm exhibitors must apply to the section secretary for same.
